Dear Friends,

The Lenten season is a special time in our church. The hymns have special meaning. The themes that lead up to Easter remind me of the most important beliefs of our faith.

Several years ago when I was attending college I was part of a Campus Ministry. The church associated with this ministry had families adopt each of us college students. There was a bus that picked us up on Campus on Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings and would take us to church. After church on Sunday morning our adopted families would spend time with us. Sometimes they would take us out to lunch and other times the entire church

had a lunch and we were invited to attend.

The people were so kind. They wanted to be an extension of our family. It took time to get used to because I was not accustomed to people feeding me and taking me places without there being something in it for them (repayment, babysitting, etc.) I didn't feel like I had earned their kindness.

Then one day the whole idea of the Lenten and Easter message dawned on me. None of us have earned what God did for us in Jesus Christ. It was a gift. We are asked to honor the giver by accepting the gift we did not merit.

I never have earned God's love, but I can respond to it. That is what we do in the community every time we perform an act of kindness in the name of Christ. That is what we do in church when we give our time and our money.

The Lenten and Easter seasons are traditionally times when giving is at a high level in our church. I think I understand why. When you make your Lenten and Easter offerings this year. I hope you will do so in thankfulness for the gift God has given us in Jesus.



With March being Women's History Month, I felt it appropriate to tell you about United Methodist Women or now United Women in Faith.


For 155 years Women from the Methodist faith have been making an impact on lives across the World.
