



Greetings! I am writing this on my first day back in the office after a week off for rest and self-care. I missed everyone but so enjoyed worshipping with you online as you received a message from Rev Heather Rose of Asbury UMC. She is amazing and I am always so grateful for her ministry.

I heard our Communications Director, Stephanie Dunn, share with you a summary of our finances for the first quarter of 2024 and that we came in \$6000 short from meeting our budget. I was amazed as she explained that this would not have happened if each one of us had given an extra \$5 each week. That really hit me hard.

Many of you may not realize that every single thing that happens in a UMC congregation is funded entirely by the offerings we receive. Pastor and staff salaries, building maintenance, insurance, utilities, and waste removal. You might be surprised to find out that just filling paper items in all our restrooms can be a costly endeavor!

All the things that happen on Sunday morning and through the week have costs as well. Copy paper and ink prices are up, and every single bulletin or printout we have is done by our staff and volunteers in our workroom with resources we have to buy, not to mention Upper Room devotionals, maintaining and running sound and video equipment, musical instruments, and supplies. Even the music we play is not free; licensees and subscriptions have to be renewed for us to be able to use them in worship.

All of those things have to be taken care of for us to be able to then focus on the ministry we are called to do: feed the hungry, lift up the homeless, take the gospel to the community, and care for the sick and grieving. Stephanie's summary made me feel challenged. So, I am extending that challenge to you.

I vow to bring with me each Sunday an extra \$5 to add to the jar which will be in both services. I will do this every Sunday for the rest of this year. If that is all it takes for this church to meet its budget and be able to do all the amazing things we are called to do, I am in! I challenge you to do the same.

I love this church and I am so excited to see where God is calling us to be the church together as we bring the love of Jesus and the grace of God to the Jacksonville community.

History was made at the UMC General Conference in North Carolina today, May 1, 2024, with a vote of 93.14% in approval of removing the harmful language against LGBTQIA+ in our Book of Discipline. This will be put in place immediately, and does not have to be approved by Annual Conferences. Regionalization is still yet to be voted on, and if approved, will have to be accepted by 2/3 of all Annual Conferences before it would go into effect. It is a monumental day for the UMC.

What does this mean for Jacksonville FUMC? We continue to be a church who loves to worship the Lord, who offers love and charity to the food and housing insecure, the left out and ignored, the marginalized and those without hope, and who thrive in a community created to share the word of God while supporting and encouraging each other. That is who we are and who we will continue to be.

If you have questions about the decisions of General Conference, we have an information session recording from this past Sunday, and will hold another information session in a week or two. My door is always open and I will be glad to discuss or explain anything.

It is a blessing to be your pastor, and I think that both the larger UMC and our Jacksonville FUMC are poised to experience a revival of the Holy Spirit. May we be open as that Grace, encouragement, discernment, and direction pour out! Let's get fired up!


